

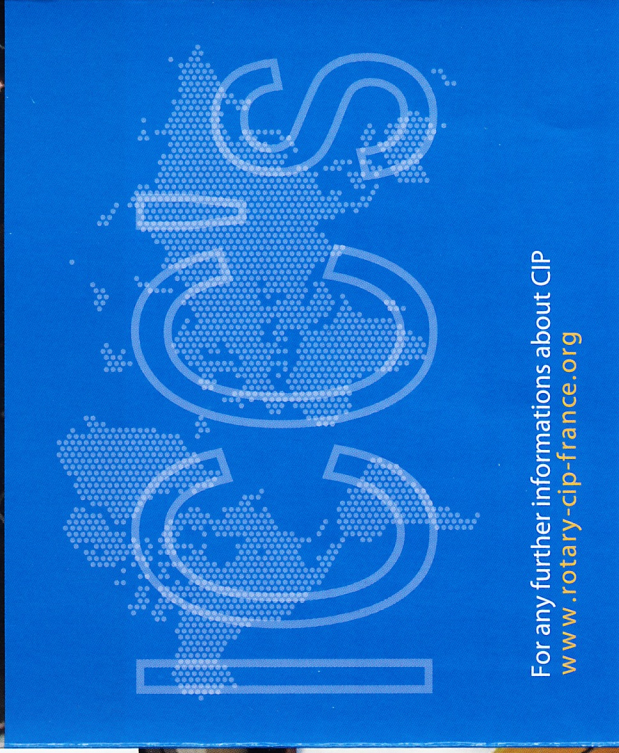


FINANCES

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BUILD PEACE AND STRENGTHEN RELATIONSHIPS

Since 1950, the Inter country Committees (ICC's) have grown steadily, after the creation of the first ICC between France and Germany, in order to promote peace and understanding among nations.

The ICC's act as backup organizations for Rotary International and for the Rotary Foundation, they contribute to the promotion of peaceful societies.

ORGANIZATION

Our National Coordination covers the French sections of our ICC's and all Districts of zone 11 of Rotary International. It coordinates all activities of the ICC's and helps promoting them. The National Coordinator is elected for three years by the governors (DG, DGE, IPDG) and by the presidents of the national sections of the ICC's.

The Executive Council supervises all National Coordinators in the zone and develops recognition for the ICC's.

The initiators of a new ICC's between two or more countries create, each in their respective countries their own section which is initially linked to a particular District, after endorsement by the Governor and by the National Coordinator.

Both sections make up the new ICC's official via a charter. Each section includes Rotarians, Clubs and founding Districts.

Both sections are autonomous and will meet yearly in a General Assembly, in each of the countries alternatively.

The mandate of their President is three years and may be renewed.

MISSIONS OF THE ICC's

The Inter country Committees gather Rotarians, spouses of Rotarians and Rotaractors who are particularly interested in relations between two particular countries.

They make themselves available to Rotary Clubs and Districts, in order to help Rotarians :

- discover the international dimension of Rotary,
- creating new clubs
- creating twin clubs,
- participating in the programs of the Rotary Foundation and particularly, in actions aiming at peace and resolution of conflicts,
- fighting for human rights.

More generally the ICC's facilitate friendly exchanges between countries.
